

STREET/LAUGHLIN (SB846)

- Adult Use program regulated by an Independent Commission
- Mandates Charter Agreements between Social Equity Applicants and existing operators
- Does not include provisions that allow individuals to apply for resentencing convictions from non-violent cannabis related offenses
- 1 permit = 3 additional locations for existing operators
- Does not regulate Delta-8, Delta-9 and other intoxicating hemp products typically sold in gas stations and smoke shops
- Caps potency of adult use products
- Revenue Allocation
 - o 80% to the Cannabis Regulation Fund
 - Revenues will support program administration, community reinvestment and public education campaigns and initiatives
 - o 10% to municipalities with cannabis businesses based on the number of establishments
 - o 10% to counties in which cannabis businesses are located in an unincorporated part of a county

KAUFER/KINKEAD (HB2500)

- Adult Use program regulated by the Department of Agriculture
- Does NOT mandate charter agreements between Social Equity Applicants and existing operators
- Includes robust provisions on resentencing that would allow individuals to apply for expungements, commutations and resentencing from non-violent cannabis related offenses
- 1 permit = 1 additional location for existing operators
- Strictly regulates Delta-8, Delta-9 and intoxicating hemp products
- No potency caps
- Revenue Allocation
 - o 30% to the Cannabis Business Establishment Fund
 - Revenues will support training, technical assistance grants and loans for entrepreneurs, small businesses and social equity applicants and licensees
 - o 30% to the Cannabis Regulation Fund
 - Revenues will support program administration, community reinvestment and public education campaigns and initiatives
 - o 15% to the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency
 - 10% For distribution to local police departments for enforcing cannabis regulations
 - 5% to be used for indigent defense services
 - o 10% to the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs for prevention and treatment services
 - o 10% to municipalities with cannabis businesses based on the number of establishments
 - o 5% for programs assisting patients, caregivers, and background checks
