- For a household to be eligible for the ERUC program, it must meet the following requirements:
 - Household must reside in Montgomery County at the time of application, AND
 - One or more individuals in the household has qualified for unemployment benefits or experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or experienced other financial hardship due, directly or indirectly, to the COVID-19 pandemic, AND

- The household can demonstrate a risk of homelessness or housing instability, AND
- Household must be at or below 80% of Area Median Income at the time of application.
- To apply for the ERUC program, residents of Montgomery County who have experienced a COVID hardship and are in need of rent and/or utility assistance should call 2-1-1 or text your zip code to 898-211.

Property Tax/Rent Rebate

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Programs allows eligible Pennsylvanians to receive a rebate on their PA property tax or rent.

- The rebate program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The income limit is \$35,000 a year for homeowners and \$15,000 annually for renters, and half of Social Security income is excluded. Spouses, personal representatives or estates may also file rebate claims on behalf of claimants who lived at least one day in the year they are filing for and meet all other eligibility criteria.
- The maximum standard rebate is \$650, but supplemental rebates for qualifying homeowners can boost rebates to \$975.
- Pennsylvanians can visit mypath.pa.gov to file their Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program applications. Applicants will be asked to provide specific information on their income and rent/property taxes. Applicants should check the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program instruction booklet to learn which information they will need to input/upload to complete the process. The instruction booklet is available online at www.revenue.pa.gov/ptrr.

- Applicants who wish to file a paper application form may obtain Property Tax/Rent Rebate claim forms (PA-1000) and related information on the Department of Revenue's website or by calling 1-888-222-9190.
- Deadline: Applications must be postmarked by June 30.
